What is ChemClear?

ChemClear is an initiative to dispose of both registered and de-registered agricultural and veterinary (agvet) chemicals. Agvet chemicals pose a serious risk to the environment and human health if incorrectly disposed of and cannot be placed in your conventional rubbish bins or poured down the drain. These chemicals are also not accepted at Resource Recovery Centres.

What chemicals does ChemClear collect?

ChemClear collects some eligible chemicals free of charge (Group 1). Group 1 chemicals will contain the drumMUSTER/ChemClear eligible logo somewhere on the container. These are chemicals that are:

- ✓ In their original container with label intact and readable
- Manufactured or supplied by companies participating in the AgStewardship programs
- Registered, suspended or withdrawn chemicals whose registration has ceased within the past two years
- ✓ Within two years of passing the chemicals expiration date

Group 2 chemicals incur a fee per L/kg, which will be provided to the waste holder for their consideration upon registration. These are chemicals that are:

- No longer registered for use (exceeding 2 years from de-registration)
- o Unknown/unlabelled
- o Exceeding two years after their expiration date
- Mixed agvet chemicals
- Chemicals from non-participating manufacturers

How can I get my chemicals collected by ChemClear?

You need to register your chemicals with ChemClear, which can be done by contacting 1800 008 182 or visiting <u>www.chemclear.com.au</u>. To register your chemicals, you will need to know the products name and manufacturer, size and condition of container and an estimate of how much of the chemical is remaining in the container. If the contents of the container are unknown (ie. Group 2), you will need to register the size and condition of the container, as well as an estimate of how much chemical remains.

ChemClear will inform you with the location and date/time of a local collection point, of which it is your responsibility to transport the chemicals safely to the collection point. The collection points are organised on a demand based service, so when there is a need for collection in your area, ChemClear will notify you. A permanent collection facility is also now available in Laverton North, although an appointment is still necessary.
