

PLAN

Three meandering paths lead to a central gathering space adjacent to the creek. The paths transition through three changes in paving material terminating in a light colour pavement at the central gathering space. On arrival visitors are greeted by three sculptural entry portals and two shadow inscription sculptures and a curved inscription wall on one side of the circular central space. The sculptural panels have laser cut inscription text which cast shadows on the central gathering space throughout the day.

SCULPTURAL ELEMENTS

The central sculptural elements overhang the central gathering space like giant tree ferns. The metal panels are inscribed with text on both the vertical and horizontal surface. Text and images will also be etched onto the metal surface telling the story of the events in February 2009. The various sculptural features cast shadows at all times of day adding a dappled kaleidoscope of shadow text to the central gathering space.

THE FINAL CONCEPT DESIGN MAY BE SUBJECT TO REVIEW AND MODIFICATION DURING THE DESIGN DEVELOPMENT AND DOCUMENTATION STAGES TO REFLECT THE NOMINATED FUNDING ALLOCATION (\$100,000) AND IN-KIND COMMUNITY SUPPORT PROVIDED.

The memorial from the north with laser cut text on the vertical surfaces of the central sculptural elements. These lead to a central gathering space which has seating made from the remnant street tree oak timber which survived the fire.


The memorial from the south with a view of the curved inscription text and mural wall. The wall stands at 2.5 metres tall with the adjacent creek trees and vegetation as the backdrop. The central gathering space can be easily viewed from the nearby existing pathway and historical steam engine.
