



# **EVENT NOTIFICATION**

On **Saturday 3 February 2018** the *Jayco Herald Sun Tour* will conduct a race stage finish at Lake Mountain Alpine Resort. The race will travel from Nagambie, through Seymour, Yarck, Alexandra, Eildon and Marysville, before climbing Lake Mountain and finishing at the top.

The Tour, now in its 65<sup>th</sup> year, is one of the many iconic sporting events held over the Victorian Summer and an important race of the State Government's *Summer of Cycling*. The 2018 season will see a prestigious field of teams and riders compete from Australia and abroad. The event is expected to deliver a significant economic impact for the region, as well as major national and international media exposure.

To ensure the safety of the riders and the community, temporary changes to traffic conditions and vehicle access in certain areas of Murrindindi Shire will be implemented. Murrindindi Shire Council will be working with GTR Events, VicRoads and Victoria Police to ensure the control of traffic for this event is conducted in a safe manner.

No vehicle access between the times set out in the table above. No parking will be permitted on these closed sections of road during these times.

A shuttle bus will operate from Arnold Gap to the Lake Mountain Alpine Resort Carpark between 2.00pm and 6.30pm.

### **Changed Traffic Conditions**

Changed traffic conditions can be expected along some sections of the race route including speed reductions along roads and at intersections. Delays due to increased cyclist and vehicle traffic can also be expected. Please allow extra time if travelling on the day.

## **Rolling Road Closure**

A 'rolling road closure' will also operate on the day, stopping traffic only as the cyclists travel along the race route. This will be managed by Victoria Police. Delays of between 15-30 minutes are expected. This means Police will stop vehicles at a safe area on the side of the road as the cyclists are approaching. These vehicles must then wait for the cyclists to pass by before being allowed to continue on their way.
