

Resource Recovery Centres



Within the Murrindindi Shire Council, residents and non-residents can utilise the services provided by 5 Resource Recovery Centres (Transfer Stations). For those residents who aren't located within an area serviced by our kerbside garbage/recycling collection, Resource Recovery Centres (RRCs) are the primary solution for waste disposal. The Shire operates RRCs in:

- ✓ Alexandra – Mt Pleasant Rd, Alexandra
- ✓ Yea – Ghin Ghin Rd, Ghin Ghin
- ✓ Kinglake – Watsons Rd, Kinglake West
- ✓ Eildon – Jerusalem Creek Rd, Eildon
- ✓ Marysville – Sunds Mill Crt, Marysville

The Shire also operates a landfill in Alexandra, which is where residual waste from the resource recovery centres is disposed. Commercial waste can also be taken directly to the landfill.

*A maximum of 1m³ of commercial waste will be accepted at RRCs. All loads exceeding 1m³ will be directed to dispose directly into landfill.

**A maximum of 3m³ of municipal/residential waste will be accepted. All loads exceeding this limit will be directed to dispose directly into landfill.

***Tyres on rims and dirty tyres not accepted

Unacceptable wastes at Murrindindi's RRCS:

- Loads of unrecyclable material exceeding 3m³
- Asbestos
- Chemicals and solvents (see fact sheet on Detox your Home for chemical disposal options)
- Syringes
- Hazardous waste

Syringes:

Council offers a free disposal service for used hypodermic needles and syringes. Contact a council office to obtain a sharp safe container. Once the container has been filled, it can be returned and swapped for another. This service is not available to commercial operators.

What can I do to make my waste drop off as easy and efficient as possible?

Sorting your load out when loading your trailer can help you to save time when you reach your local RRC, but it can also **save you money**. As quite a number of recyclable items can be dropped off free of charge, if these items are sorted into separate piles in your load, they are easily identifiable and measurable by our RRC operators.

Materials should be sorted according to the "Materials" Column in the table above. Where recyclables are concerned, it is best if these can be sorted into piles of each individual item where possible, as this will make it easier for you to drop the items off in separate areas of the RRCs.
