

What is MobileMuster?

MobileMuster is a not for profit mobile phone recycling program which diverts used mobile phones from being disposed in landfill. Mobile phones contain a wide array of valuable reusable resources which can be separated and reused. Diverting mobile phones from landfill reduces the amount of harmful materials that are entering landfill, which could have a negative environmental impact.

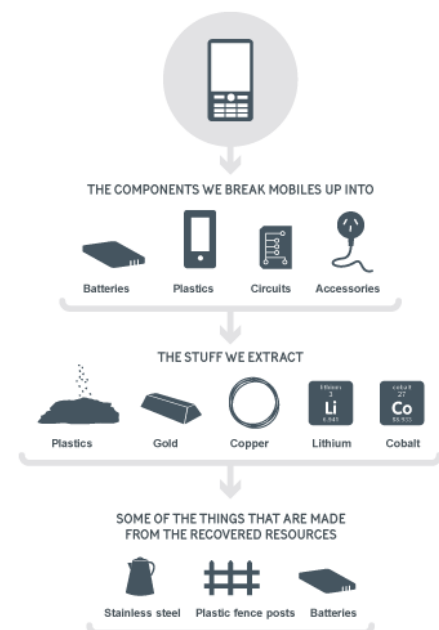
Where can I drop off my used mobile phone for recycling?

Murrindindi Shire Council is an official collection point for MobileMuster. You can bring your old mobile phone handset, battery and charger into your nearest council office and look for the MobileMuster collection point.

What happens to my old mobile phone after it has been collected for recycling?

Mobile phones are collected for recycling and transported to a processing and sorting facility. Around 90% of mobile handsets are recoverable in the recycling process, including materials such as:

-  Plastics
-  Copper
-  Iron
-  Nickel
-  Zinc
-  Silver
-  Ceramics
