Breakaway Bridge, Acheron

Council is hosting a meeting for the Acheron community, to speak with you about the condition of Breakaway Bridge, the protective rock works on the northern bank and the process and next steps from here.

Thornton

The installation of stormwater backflow prevention gates will begin shortly in Thornton.

Council is installing backflow prevention gates, also known as reflux valves or flap gates, on the two stormwater outflow pipes that empty into the waterway on Taggerty-Thornton Road, Thornton. These flood gates will prevent stormwater from flowing back into the stormwater system when the water level in the creek rises above the level of the drains, while allowing the drains to function normally once the water recedes.

Fabrication of the flood gates has been completed, and contractors will begin to install them in the near future.
