

Filming and Photography in Murrindindi Shire

Introduction

The Murrindindi Shire is a film-friendly location while balancing the local amenity of residents and businesses.

The information on this page relates to commercial filming, including television, feature films, advertising and television commercials, documentaries and music videos.

All commercial filming activities are required to apply for a permit for the use of a public space. This ensures the activity is in accordance with the regulations of Murrindindi Shire Council.

Filming and permits

Some commercial filming activities trigger the need to apply for a permit for the use of a public space. This ensures the activity is in accordance with our regulations.

We endeavour to keep red tape to a minimum and encourage you to speak to a member of Council's Community Safety team in the first instance. We will be your point of contact and assist you to identify any other permission/permits required from other land managers and/or statutory authorities.

Do you need a permit? – Low Impact Filming

Most people conducting commercial filming must apply for a permit to use a public space. However, if your filming activities are minor and 'low impact' (refer to criteria below), you may not need a permit. Please check-in with our Community Safety team first to determine if a [Local Law Short Term Activity Permit](#) is required.

To approve any filming activities, we will require a copy of your current public liability Insurance with a minimum cover of \$20 million, along with details regarding the proposed filming dates, with a minimum of two weeks' notice.

Low impact filming activities are defined by these criteria:

- a filming activity of six people or less (includes all production crew and talent);
- no more than one camera, one tripod, and handheld sound recording equipment;
- public safety is maintained at all times and all public pathways, footpaths and roads must not be blocked;
- no exclusive use of public space; and
- filming content and messaging do not undermine Council's core values and the sustainability of our destination.
