## What can go in your kerbside recycling bin?



All types of paper including magazines, pamphlets, note pads, envelopes and office paper.

> Remove soft plastic from newspapers and magazine



All types of cardboard including archive boxes, food boxes and packing boxes.

- > No waxed cardboard
- > Remove food scraps



### Bottles and containers.

- > Keep lids and labels on plastic bottles
- > Yoghurt containers and fruit punnets are recyclable too



### Food containers and aerosol cans.

> No need to rinse out steel containers, but remove food liquid



### Foil, drink cans and aerosol cans.

> Remember to scrunch foil into a loose ball



### Bottles and jars.

> Keep unbroken where possible
